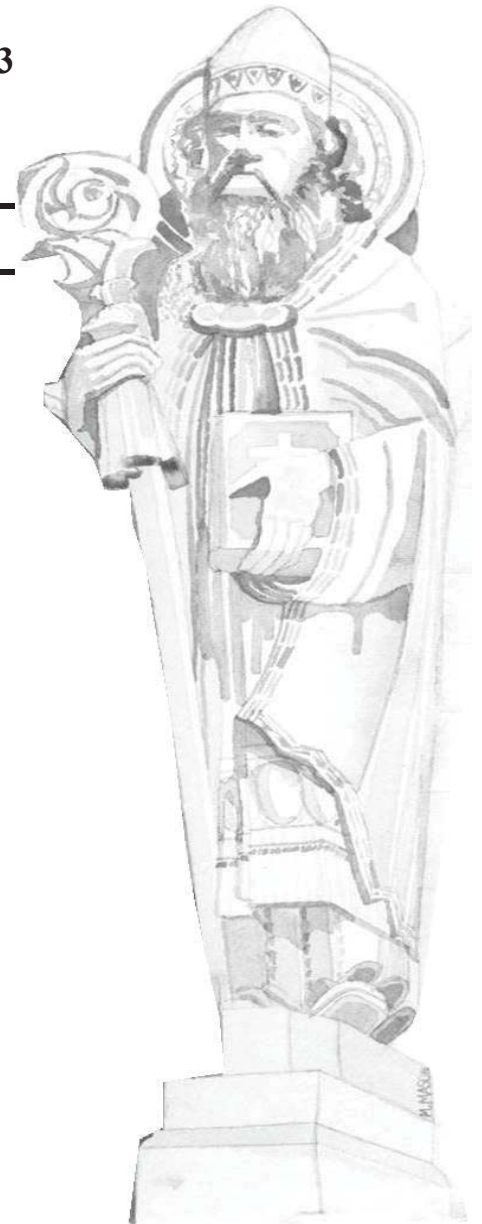

THE TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“I have come to light a fire on the earth.” Jesus does justify that when he touches any human being. He ignites us to live fully, he pushes us into the rapids of divine love. His own life shows us this. He constantly met new and interesting characters (from wealthy tax collectors to lepers). He was faced with every kind of human problem. He enjoyed banquets and fasted for weeks in the desert. He asked little children to come into his presence and at other times he had fierce battles with the Pharisees. In every situation, the presence of God touched lives. We are now his followers and do a disservice if we turn Christianity into a routine set of rules that contain people but does not inspire them. With Christ, let us echo the first line of the Gospel in our hearts and in our actions: “We have come to light a fire on the earth.” We, too, carry the presence of the living God to the street corners, the characters, the problems, and children we meet.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: “Like the prophet Jeremiah, we sometimes feel as if we are trapped in the mud and being punished because of our convictions and our unwillingness to waver from them. 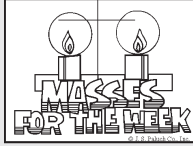
