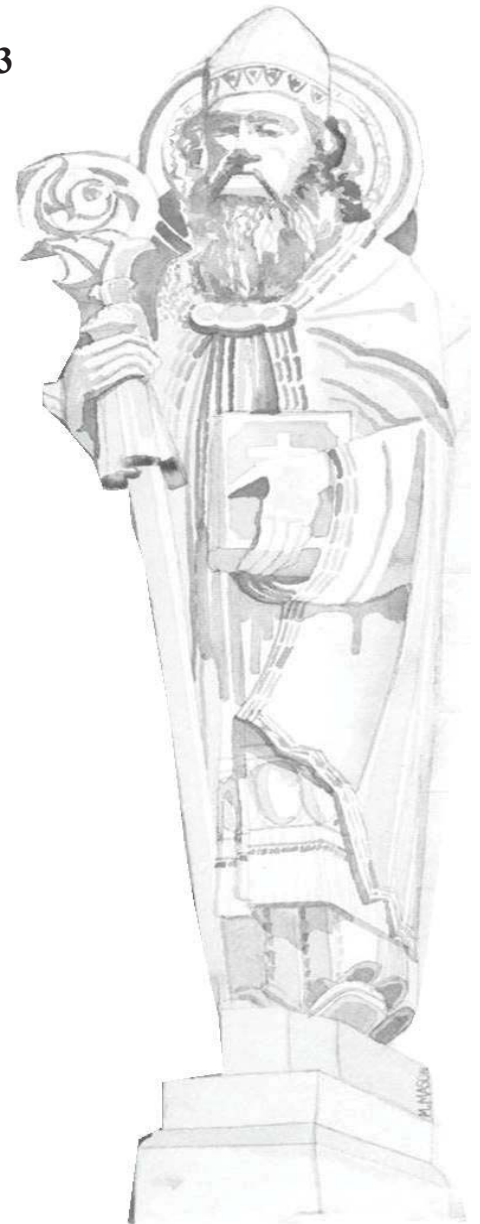

THE TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today we would probably define wise people as those who "have their act together." They are people who have ordered their lives properly—for Christians, in accord with the teaching of Christ. That teaching comes from more than textbooks and classrooms. It comes from knowing the Lord in the sense of experiencing God. The Eucharist stands at the very heart of that experience. St. John stresses the internal change which the Eucharist effects—Christ in us and we in Christ. God the source of all wisdom, is instructing and guiding us on the journey of life. We need to reflect in prayer on this great mystery and come to an understanding that Christ is the way, the truth and the life. The Eucharist is our pledge of eternity also. Our frequent attendance at the Eucharist, wherever the celebration might occur, is essential to our unity as members of the family circle of God.

Thoughts to Reflect on and Share: From Deacon Herb:

"If we ever doubt that the Eucharist is the true body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ, all we have to do is read His own words in scripture, 'unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you.'
