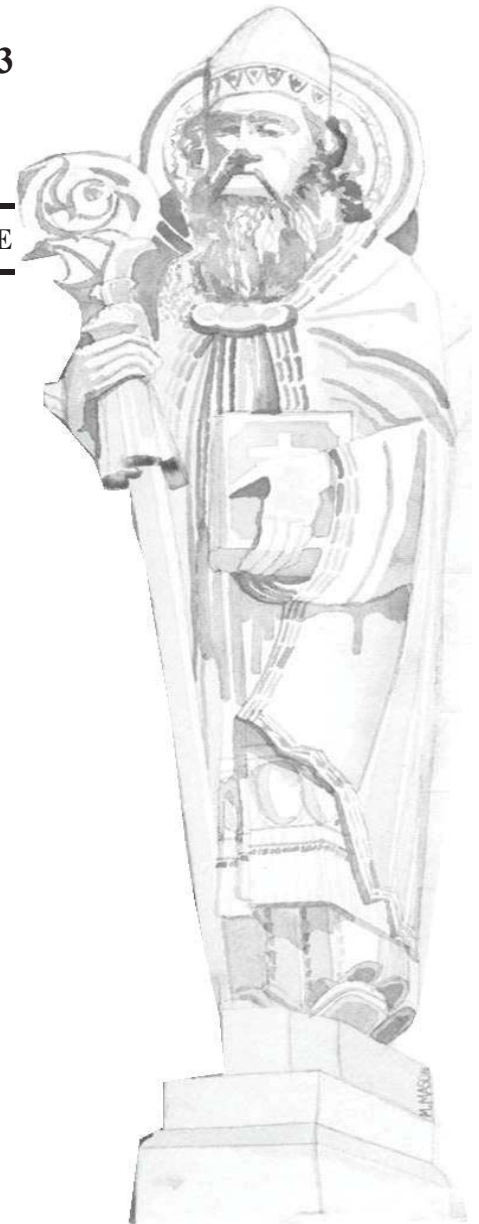

THE TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

How is a person saved? "Try to come through the narrow door," Jesus replies. He is not telling us that we should purposely make life difficult for ourselves. He does not mean that if a way of acting is pleasant and comfortable, it must automatically be judged as wrong. The "narrow door" implies directness. It means confronting the crisis and problems of life directly. It means facing squarely the issues that the teachings of Jesus raise. The "broad door" is the pathway of procrastination, of "getting out of" facing things, of passing one's own burdens to others. Jesus himself is an excellent model of the narrow-door approach to life. He confronts the scribes and Pharisees in their misguided use of religion. He also challenges simple fishermen and laborers to leave their livelihoods to do an impossible mission. He challenges his people for all time to face each day directly fortified by the truth of his message and the example he has given in his life, the lesson of the true human life in the image and likeness of God.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

St. Colman Religious Education Program begins in September on Tuesday evenings from 6-7:30pm for grades K-8. **Please Note:** It is a Diocesan Policy for all students to receive a **minimum of 2 full years** of education before the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist (grades 1 and 2) and **8 full years** before Confirmation. If your child does not attend a Catholic School, make sure they are registered. If you are a member of another parish, permission from your pastor is required to attend St. Colman. Registration will begin this month. Forms have been sent out, please return them to the rectory with your registration fee. If you did not receive the forms call the rectory office at 412-823-2564 and they will be mailed to you. This year we are opening our Kindergarten class to 4 & 5 year olds. 4 year olds must be 4 before September 1st.

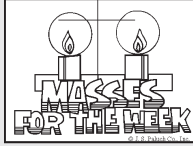
