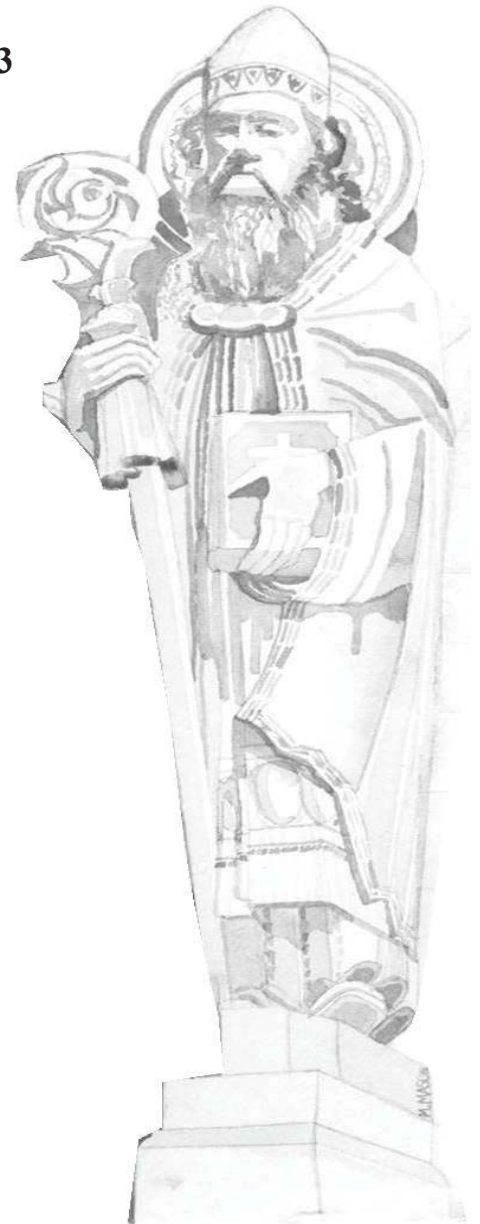

TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

After Jesus had cured the deaf man, he gave the people who has witnessed the event an unusual command. He enjoined them strictly not to tell anyone. It was not false humility. It was not just a private act for the good of the deaf man alone. Jesus knew that the crowds would publicize the wrong thing. They were amazed at the physical cure. They marveled at the things Jesus could do. But the meaning of the cure is that it manifests the presence of God among us. Through this healing, Jesus wanted people to recognize that God’s message of salvation was now being communicated to humankind. Instead of calling everyone to come listen to Jesus’ word, they aroused the local people to come to seek more miracles. It is easy to become overwhelmed in events or an attractive evangelist, but if we do not hear the challenging message of Christ about love, justice, equality through it all, then we have missed the stuff of authentic religion. Healings were means that Jesus used; the end was that people would hear the Word of God and keep it.

BISHOP’S EDUCATION FUND COLLECTION

The annual Bishop’s Education Fund Collection will be taken up on the weekend of September 12-13th. Since the fund was established in 1995, more than \$20.8 million has been raised. In the past 20 years, almost \$11.6 million in assistance has been given to nearly 41,000 children from nearly every parish in the diocese. Many students in our diocese want a Catholic school education, but a number of those students can only do so with financial assistance. The Bishop’s Education Fund makes such assistance available.

St. Colman Parish Religious Education Program begins in September on Tuesday evenings from 6-7:30pm for grades K-8. Please Note: It is a Diocesan Policy for all students to receive a **minimum of 2 full years** of education before the reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist (grades 1 and 2) and **8 full years** before Confirmation. If your child does not attend a Catholic School, make sure they are registered. If you are a member of another parish, permission from your pastor is required to attend St. Colman. Registration will begin in August. This year we are opening our kindergarten class to 4 & 5 year olds. 4 year olds must be 4 before September 1st.
