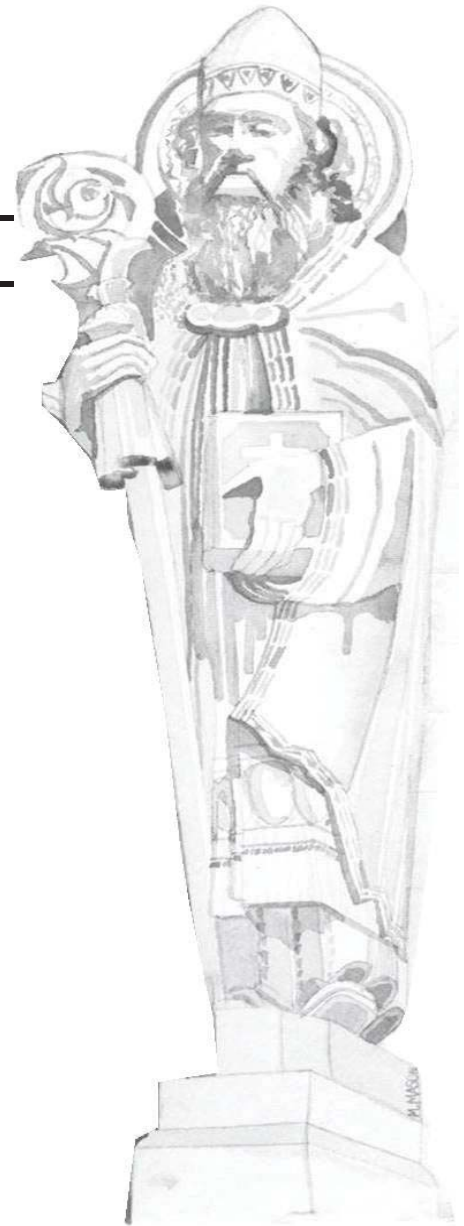

**THE TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY  
OF ORDINARY TIME**

After Jesus had cured the deaf man, he gave the people who had witnessed the event an unusual command. He enjoined them strictly not to tell anyone. It was not false humility. It was not just a private act for the good of the deaf man alone. Jesus knew that the crowds would publicize the wrong thing. They were amazed at the physical cure. They marveled at the things Jesus could do. But the meaning of the cure is that it manifests the presence of God among us. Through this healing, Jesus wanted people to recognize that God's message of salvation was now being communicated to humankind. Instead of calling everyone to come listen to Jesus' word, they aroused the local people to come and seek more miracles. It is easy to become overwhelmed in events or an attractive evangelist, but if we do not hear the challenging message of Christ about love, justice, equality through it all, then we have missed the stuff of authentic religion. Healings were means that Jesus used: the end was that people would hear the Word of God and keep it.

**LITTLE ROCK SCRIPTURE STUDY**

This continuing Bible Study will begin this season with the Gospel according to Mark, on Tuesday, September 18th and will meet **every other** Tuesday from 6:45-8:15pm of which 20 minutes is video commentary. This study has 10 sessions, incorporating an introductory session and 9 lessons. The Study Set is \$14 and is purchased at the study. The shortest of the four gospels, Mark is the earliest account of Jesus' life. With no mention of Jesus' infancy, Mark begins with Jesus' baptism in the Jordan by John and climaxes with the announcement of his resurrection to the women of the tomb. Mark asks everyone to answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" and challenges believers in every generation to accept the harsh reality of the cross. Mark, along with Matthew and Luke, is one of the synoptic gospels. Anyone is welcome to join our small group of about 10 or stop in and see what it is about. Refreshments are served.
