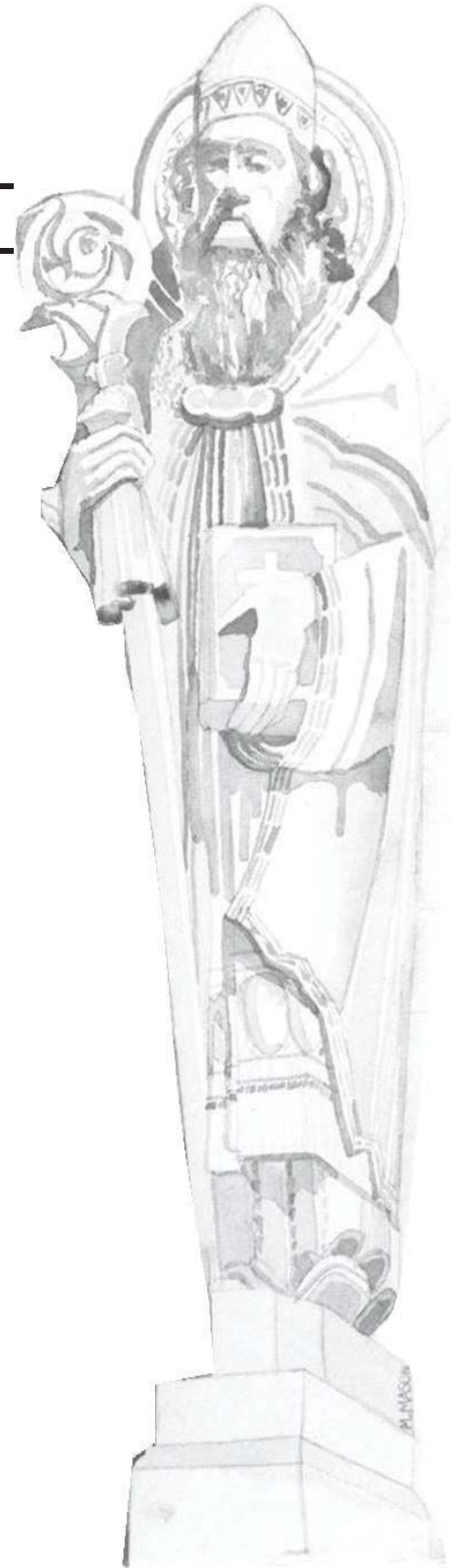

THE TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Jesus often spoke of forgiveness, and even of the consequences of not offering forgiveness to others. In our Gospel story we have the story of the man who was forgiven by his king, but who then refused to forgive a fellow slave. The consequences were painful. His words were clear and strong: "So my heavenly Father, will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother and sister from your heart." We must learn how to forgive others. To forgive another person is nothing less than creating a thing of beauty. Forgiveness has a power that is unique to itself. It destroys the distance and coldness that blocks the friendship between people. It opens up the space that can lead to a new and stronger relationship of love and caring. It can destroy old hurts and bring a freshness into people's lives in a way that few other things can. To forgive does not mean to overlook the wrong. Your forgiving means that you acknowledge that the other person did some serious wrong. Yes, the other person is at fault. But you have decided not to seek revenge or retaliate. This is what God does for us and this what we do for each other.

FROM THE NPM PITTSBURGH CHAPTER -
Dated July 26, 2011

At the diocesan new Mass "sing through" last night at St. Margaret's in Greentree, Father Chepponis announced that the musicians of the diocese may begin implementing the newly translated sections of the Mass-- **provided they are sung beginning September.** Those being: Gloria, Sanctus, Memorial Acclamations. If these sections of the Mass are recited, they are to be done so with the present translation until November 27th.

ST COLMAN AGENDA FOR THE NEW SUNG
MASS TRANSLATIONS

We plan to begin singing the New Mass Settings beginning the first weekend in October for both the Weekend and Weekday Masses. Five new Masses have been ordered and we will begin using only three to start.

The Mass for Christian Unity - will be used during October and November. **Pew cards** with the music will be provided. (New Mass - Weekend and Weekdays)

The Danish Amen Mass - will be used October and November weekdays only. During Advent we will sing for Weekend Masses. **Pew cards** with the music will be provided. (Revised Mass)

The Mass of Wisdom - will be used during Feast Times, i.e., Christmas and Easter and during the week as well. **Pew cards** With music will be provided. (New Mass)

PLEASE NOTE... The biggest change has been the wording in the Gloria, but also, we are now using the entire piece together. There will no longer be antiphonal settings where the congregation only sings the refrain. We will now sing it from beginning to end as a worshipping community.

CHIMBOTE DINNER

For the past 46 years, the Diocese of Pittsburgh has hosted a dinner to raise funds for the Church's work in Chimbote, Peru. Over the years, our diocese has supported the mission by sending priests and others to spread the Gospel by serving the poorest of the poor in the maternity hospital, clinic and orphanage there. In a recent letter of gratitude to Bishop Zubik from his brother Bishop Piorno of Chimbote, Bishop Piorno reported that more than 90,000 babies have been born through this beautiful mission outreach from the people of Pittsburgh to our sisters and brothers in Chimbote. The proceeds from recent dinners, for example, have helped the mission hospital and clinic to purchase life saving fetal heart monitors and cancer screening equipment. This year's dinner will be held on Thursday, October 13th at the Sheraton Station Square. Fr. Jim, Cheryl and I will be attending and we would like to invite all of you to join us at our table.
