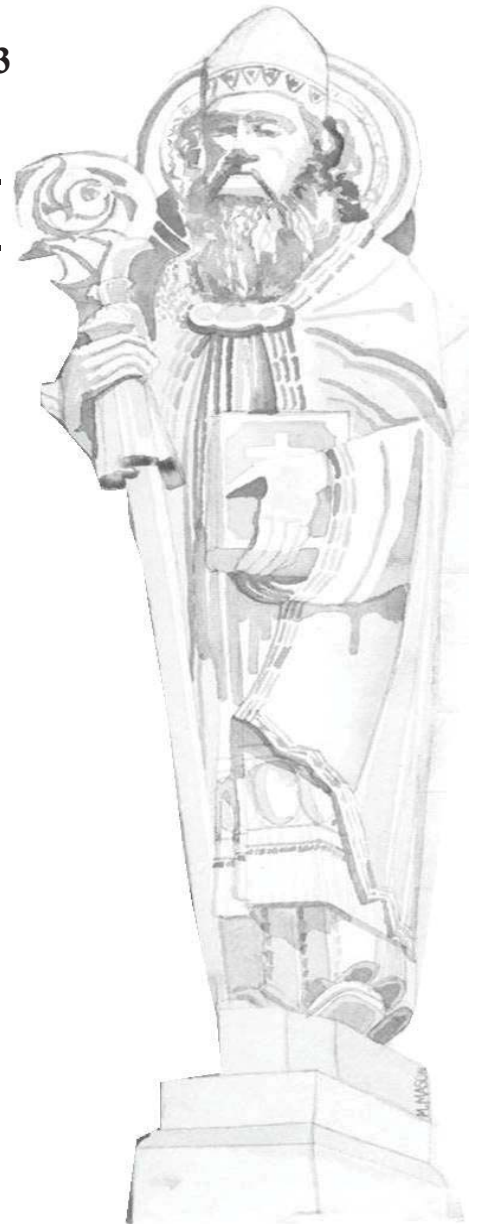

TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's liturgy reminds us that the name "Christian" configures us to one person: Jesus Christ. The pursuit of the Christian life is certain to entail hardship and sacrifice if it is taken seriously. There is no need to seek the cross or invent it. St. James in the second speaks of faith's call to action, especially in the service of others. We cannot look at the poor and simply wish them well. But to do more will often mean sacrifice. Sacrifice and penance in the service of God's reign; doing without in order that others may have; foregoing an activity to be available to a sick person are examples of cross-bearing that can be easily multiplied. These actions define the Christian, total dedication to living and proclaiming the "good news" of Jesus Christ.

Thoughts to Reflect on and Share: From Deacon Herb:

CAMPAIGN FOR THE CHURCH ALIVE UPDATE

Thank You! Thank You! Through the generosity of all who are participating in the campaign we are now able to address a priority from the case statement for allocating the funds returned to the parish. The health of the church organ has been declining. A process involving staff members, finance members and pastoral council has taken place over the last couple of months. A generous deal for replacement of the organ has surfaced and we are ready to move forward. The cost in our original case statement was only an estimate but in our deliberations it became evident it was far below a realistic amount. Therefore the original amount has to be officially increased with the campaign program. The new figure was \$76,000. This figure reflects a very generous offer for an organ that is actually much more. Your continued generosity in fulfilling pledge payments will allow us to not only purchase this organ at a bargain but to follow up other projects in our case statement, addressing roofs, bathrooms, etc. Anyone who has not participated in the campaign is invited to still do so.
