

#### <u>THE TWENTY - FOURTH SUNDAY IN</u> ORDINARY TIME

Today's gospel is the story of three hearts. The younger son had a restless heart, not content with what he had. He needed to break away from his family to experience something else. He didn't care who he hurt. When we allow unreasonable and selfish desires to take over, we don't care about the consequences. The older son's heart was filled with resentment. He had no capacity for a joyful response when he saw his father's generosity towards his brother. Such a heart is filled with envy and jealousy and small-mindedness. Finally we come to the heart of the father. What a wonderfully healthy heart he had. He accepted both of his sons and even though he didn't agree with what they did, he loved them completely, showing understanding, acceptance and forgiveness that was almost divine. His heart was open. This is the heart which God shows to each of us. There is nothing that we have done that can keep us out of the heart of our gracious and all forgiving God. We must imitate him.
