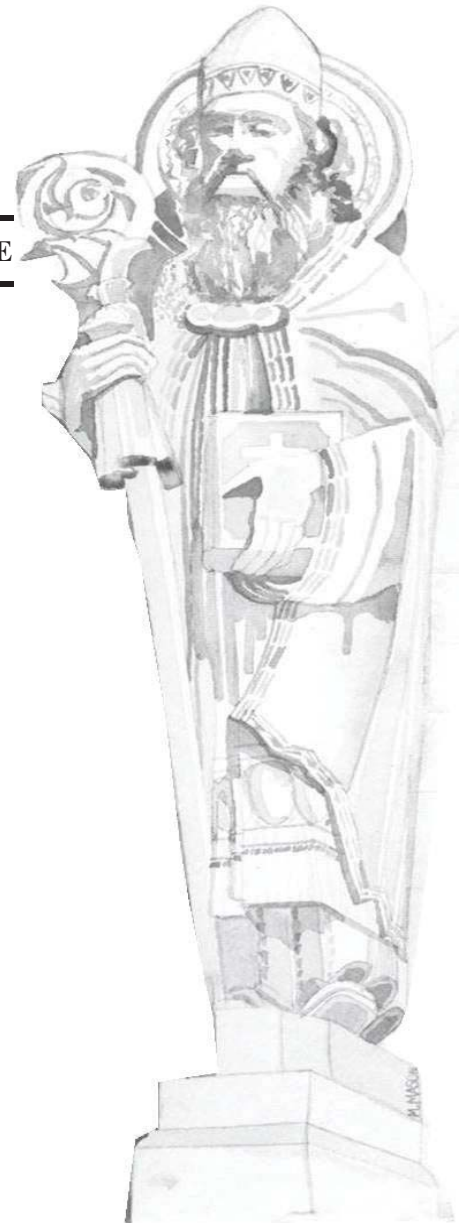

**THE TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY**  
**OF ORDINARY TIME**

Today's liturgy reminds us that the name "Christian" configures us to one person: Jesus Christ. The pursuit of the Christian life is certain to entail hardship and sacrifice if it is taken seriously. There is no need to seek the cross or invent it. St. James in the second reading speaks of faith's call to action, especially in the service of others. We cannot look at the poor and simply wish them well. But to do more will often mean sacrifice. Sacrifice and penance in the service of God's reign; doing without in order that others may have; forgoing an activity to be available to a sick person are all examples of cross-bearing that can be easily multiplied. These actions define the Christian, total dedication to living and proclaiming the "good news" of Jesus Christ.

**LITTLE ROCK SCRIPTURE STUDY**

This continuing Bible Study will begin this season with the Gospel according to Mark, on Tuesday, September 18th and will meet **every other** Tuesday from 6:45-8:15pm of which 20 minutes is video commentary. This study has 10 sessions, incorporating an introductory session and 9 lessons. The Study Set is \$14 and is purchased at the study. The shortest of the four gospels, Mark is the earliest account of Jesus' life. With no mention of Jesus' infancy, Mark begins with Jesus' baptism in the Jordan by John and climaxes with the announcement of his resurrection to the women of the tomb. Mark asks everyone to answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" and challenges believers in every generation to accept the harsh reality of the cross. Mark, along with Matthew and Luke, is one of the synoptic gospels. Anyone is welcome to join our small group of about 10 or stop in and see what it is about. Refreshments are served. All ministers including catechists, staff, choir, ushers, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, etc. are required by the Diocese of Pittsburgh to be cleared in the following ways: 1) Be registered on the Diocesan Database. 2) Sign the Code of Pastoral Conduct. 3) Be cleared by the Dept. of Public Welfare for Child Abuse. 4) Be cleared by the State Police Criminal Record Check. 5) Attend Protecting God's Children for Adults Workshop.
