

THE TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Often called the prophet of social justice, Amos addresses the unjust practices of his time in which the disadvantaged were clearly being exploited. The Lucan parable, combined with accompanying sayings of Jesus, speaks of the proper use of material goods within the context of the Christian community. In the gospel the steward is applauded by his master because of his enlightened use of material goods. Two statements speak of honesty and fidelity in administering the wealth of others and the dangers of becoming enslaved to material goods. Material goods, not evil in themselves, are necessary for life and are meant to be shared. Each of us must respond to this gospel challenge as part of our faith journey. Our situations are unique, therefore our responses will vary. But God has blessed us all in different ways: goods, talents, abilities, personalities. Each contribution will help build community.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: "Without change we become complacent, stagnant and even disaffected. Our faith calls us to constantly change in order to improve our lives and the lives of all the faithful, especially in their personal relationship with Jesus Christ."
