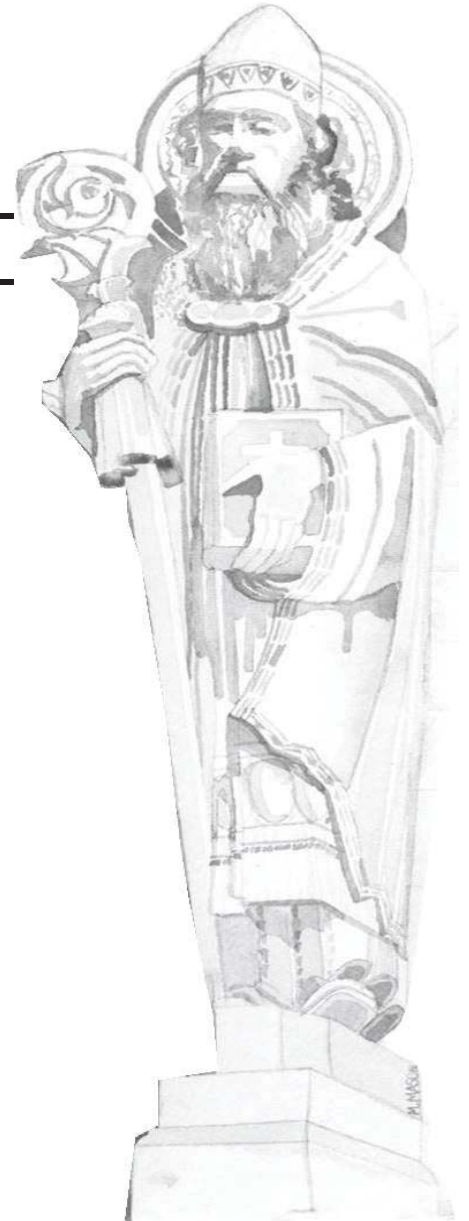

**THE TWENTY - FIFTH SUNDAY IN
ORDINARY TIME**

Often called the prophet of social justice, Amos addresses the unjust practices of his time in which the disadvantaged were clearly being exploited. The Lucan parable, combined with accompanying sayings of Jesus, speaks of the proper use of material goods within the context of the Christian community. In the gospel the steward is applauded by his master because of his enlightened use of material goods. Two statements speak of honesty and fidelity in administering the wealth of others and the dangers of becoming enslaved to material goods. Material goods, not evil in themselves, are necessary for life and are meant to be shared. Each of us must respond to this gospel challenge as part of our faith journey. Our situations are unique, therefore our responses will vary. But God has blessed us all in different ways: goods, talents, abilities, personalities. Each contribution will help build community.

**Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time:
A Family Perspective**

Despite all our time saving gadgets, we still have less leisure and family time. To solve this we created the Myth of Quality Time. Don't be fooled: Quality Time is Quantity Time. Jesus counsels us today, we "cannot serve two masters" and expect to be happy. Dedicate time to your family. No one in their final hours regretted not spending more time at work.
