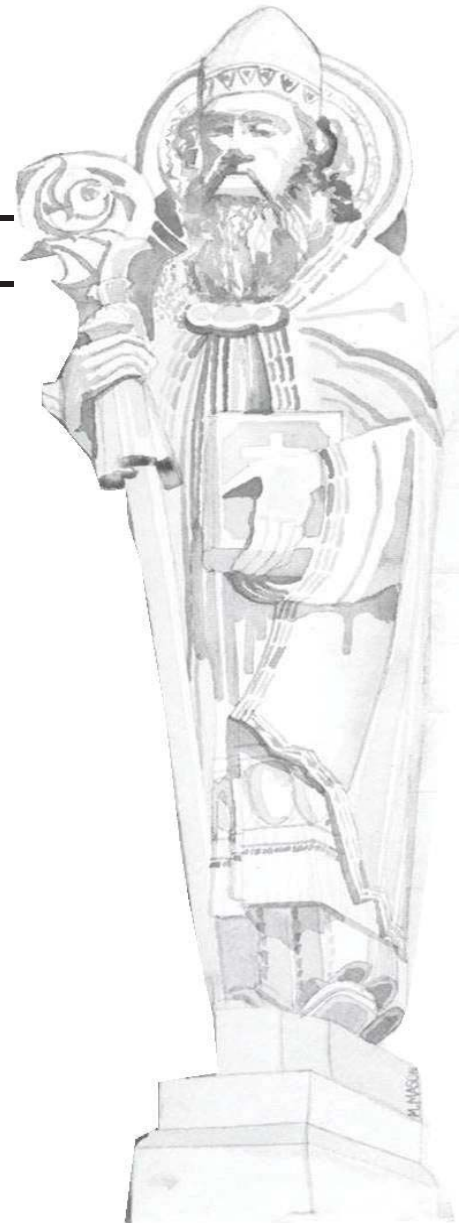

**THE TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY
OF ORDINARY TIME**

Jesus does something in this Sunday's gospel that he does frequently. He praises little children. He encourages his disciples to see the reflection of himself in children. On another occasion he insists that the children aren't bothering him and wants them near him: "Let the children alone, and do not stop them from coming to me." Finally he tell his followers: "Unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." Jesus is praising the straightforwardness of little children, their lack of deceit, the fact that they are unspoiled and untainted by the kind of experience that makes so many individuals so manipulative, sarcastic and pessimistic. "Be like children," Jesus says full of enthusiasm and directness and optimism. We are also reminded that we are all children of the same Father in heaven who loves each of us unconditionally. Not only do we respond in love to the Father but we must recognize each other as sisters and brothers; our love and service to one another is essential.
