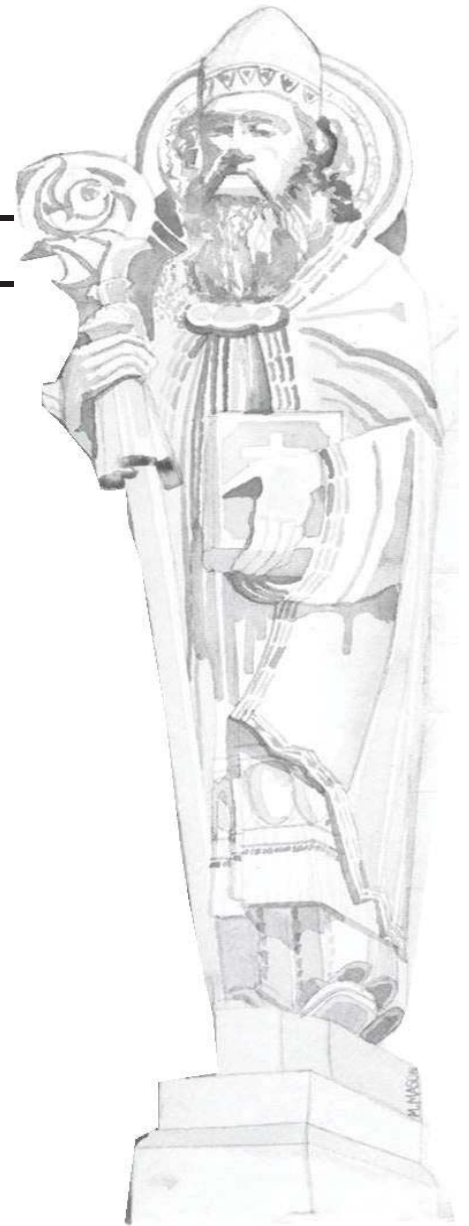

**THE TWENTY - SIXTH SUNDAY IN
ORDINARY TIME**

The parable of Lazarus and the rich man speaks to our hearts. In some ways, we may be able to identify with either of the individuals. In any event, we are asked to place ourselves into the scene and to ask some difficult questions. If we identify with the rich man, how do we share the gifts and richness that we have? Are we blind to the needs of those who are in front of our eyes, at our door or on the street where we live? If we see ourselves as the poor man, do we see a hope for our resurrection into new life through and during our suffering? We all have a part to play in the drama of the spiritual journey, and Jesus calls us to the same happy ending into the Kingdom. How well do we respond to those needy around us? In order to be in the right relationship with God, we cannot deny the relationship we have with others.

In today's gospel the rich man died and was condemned to a "place of torment" because he ignored the poor. He asked Lazarus to go and warn his five brothers to change their ways. Evidently ignoring the poor was a family pattern. Is your family sensitive to the poor?
