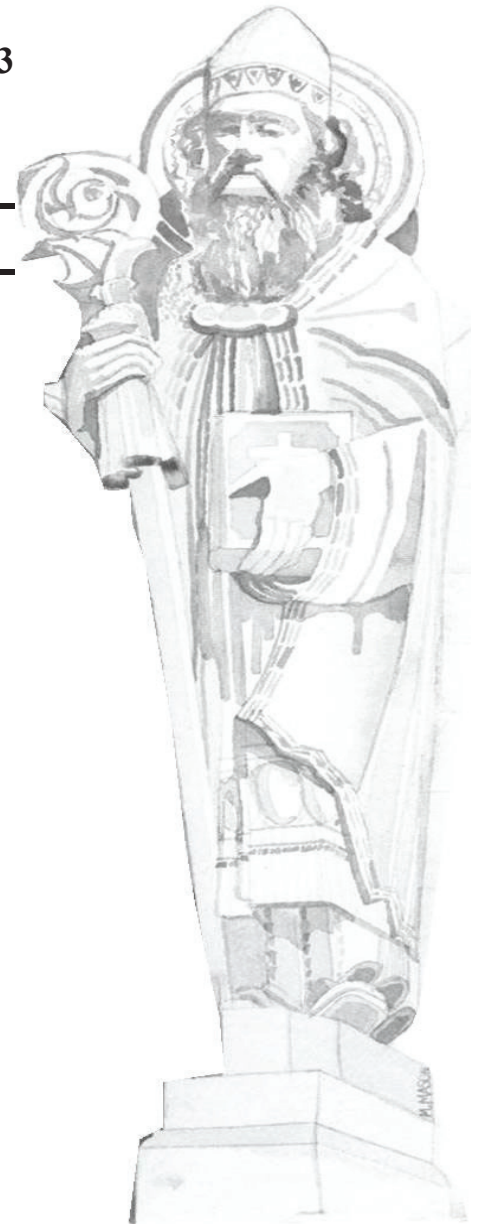

*Prayer does not always result in a request granted. But perseverance in prayer strengthens rather than diminishes faith. Perseverance enables us to see beyond particular needs and to view ourselves as part of a larger plan which ultimately brings us to God. The prayer of petition is a very noble form of prayer. *Suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. From ancient times, there is evidence of this anointing of the sick in the Church's tradition. This rite has been designated as one of the seven Sacraments, signs of God's presence in our lives. On Saturday, October 15th a Mass of Anointing will be celebrated at 11 am. Those individuals troubled by sickness, chronic illness, facing surgery, old age, physical handicaps or mental struggles are invited to receive the Sacrament. Family members are encouraged to attend the Liturgy. **Soul Searchers Halloween Bash**

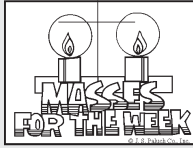
