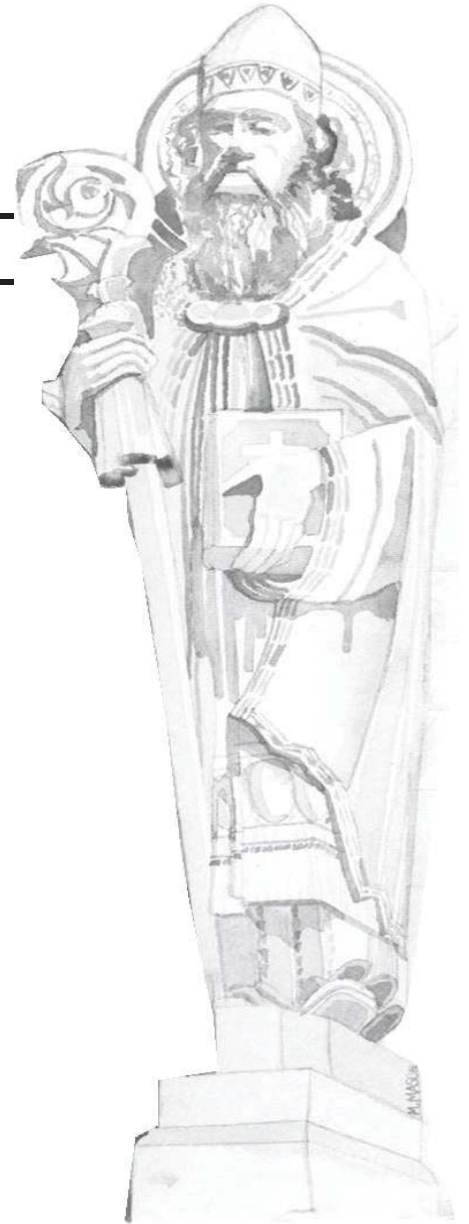

**THE TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY
OF ORDINARY TIME**

The disciples were more than a little nervous at what Jesus told the rich man. They had already given up everything to follow Jesus, but they still were uncertain about their own eternity. Jesus assured them that they would get back all they had given up and much more. While still living an earthly life, it would be as hard for the disciples to understand this as for us; but like the disciples, we must believe and trust completely in God's plan. It is hard for us to humble ourselves and give up all that we think brings us power, pleasure, and control. For when we give up these tangibles, we relinquish them for something we can't see and won't see for a long time to come. What we are offered exists in a world we don't yet understand. But we can take heart in the fact that Jesus, too, humbled himself to come to be among us and show us what the message is all about. What if he had been as reluctant as the rich man or us? It will be hard for us to give ourselves completely to God - with no holding back. But for our trust and surrender, we will purchase the reward of eternal life.

MASS OF ANOINTING

Suffering and illness have always been among the greatest problems that trouble the human spirit. From ancient times, there is evidence of this anointing of the sick in the church's tradition. This rite has been designated as one of the seven Sacraments, signs of God's presence in our lives. On Saturday, October 20th a Mass of Anointing will be celebrated at 11am. Those individuals troubled by sickness, chronic illness, facing surgery, old age, physical handicaps or mental struggles are invited to receive the Sacrament. Family members are encouraged to attend the Liturgy.

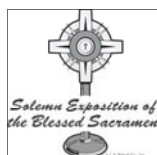

All ministers including catechists, staff, choir, ushers, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, etc. are required by the Diocese of Pittsburgh to be cleared in the following ways: 1) Be registered on the Diocesan Database. 2) Sign the Code of Pastoral Conduct. 3) Be cleared by the Dept. of Public Welfare for Child Abuse. 4) Be cleared by the State Police Criminal Record Check. 5) Attend Protecting God's Children for Adults Workshop.
