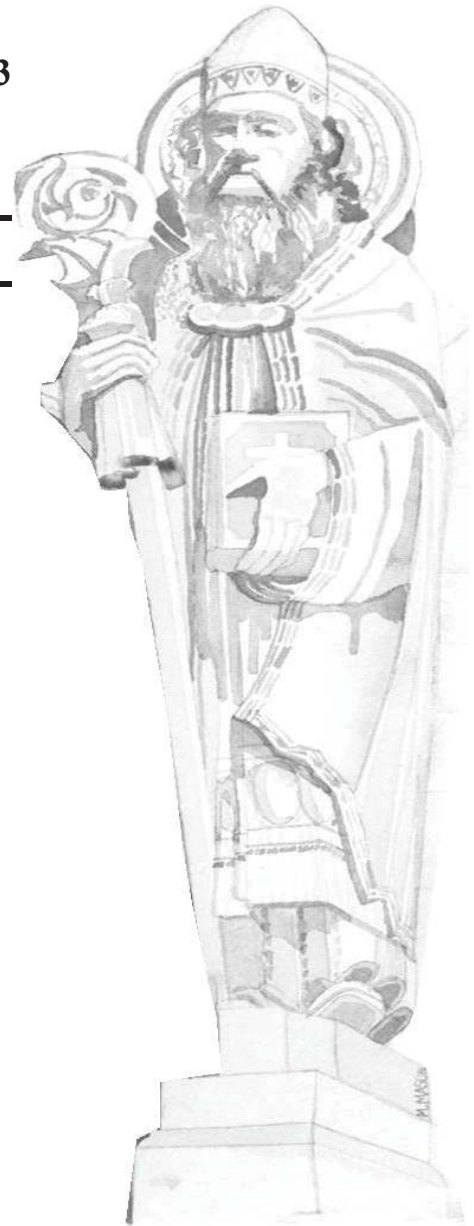

For centuries, many have interpreted the gospel of this Sunday as the decisive statement of Jesus concerning the relationship of church and state. However, it seems unlikely, in this confrontation by the Pharisees, that Jesus was intending to teach an all-encompassing theory about the roles of politics and religion in life. Jesus recognizes the trap of the Pharisees and redirects our focus. "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's but give to God what is God's." There is a fundamental truth in his answer. The world represents many images after which we can model our lives. However, as Christians we have already been gifted with an image. We have been created in the image and likeness of our God, who is love. It is through living out this identity as a son or a daughter of God, reflecting who we really are called to be and become for others, do we find truth fulfillment and peace.
