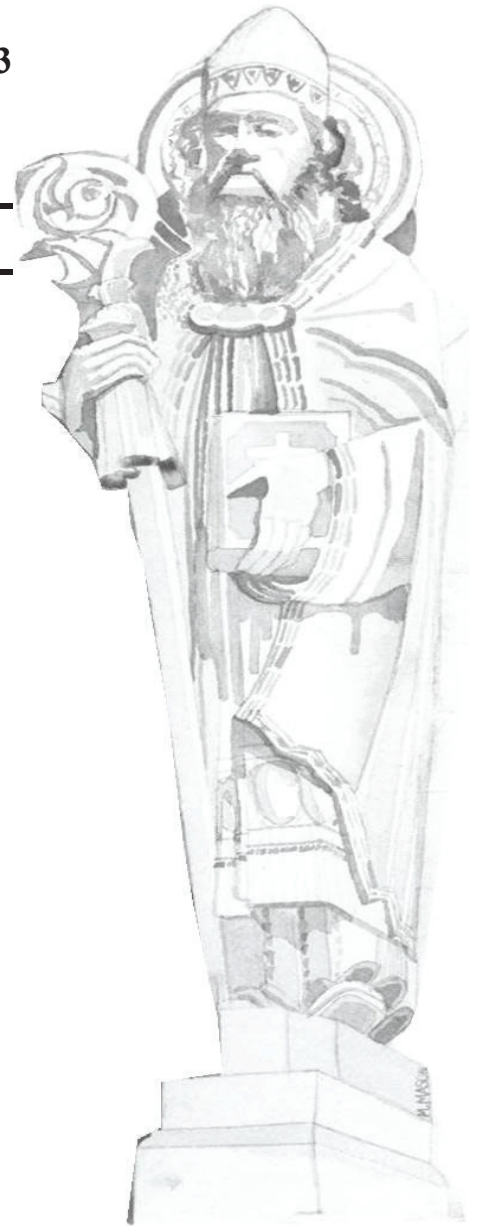

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

What is going on between Jesus and Zaccheus that causes Zaccheus to declare suddenly, "Look, I've decided to give half my property to the poor, and I'll pay back four times the amount to anyone I've cheated"? After all Jesus didn't choose Zaccheus because he was worthy. Jesus doesn't equate Zaccheus with his sins. He calls out to him and honors him with an invitation. He creates an opening in Zaccheus' narrow life because sin always narrows our souls. Then we hear the amazing transformation, his words of repentance. Jesus has the last word: "Today salvation has come to his house." whatever causes our brokenness - whether it is an illness, guilt, depression, personal tragedy or a sinful pattern of behavior - Jesus is looking for us. He wants to bind up our wounds. May we always realize Jesus is gazing into our eyes with love, asking to come to our house today. May we have the spirit of repentance and openness to the power of God as Zaccheus taught us today.

Thoughts to reflect on and share: "In a world so full of self-centeredness and arrogance, we only need to look at the work of the missionaries to see what it means to be selfless and humble. 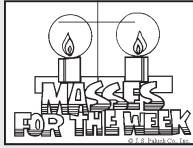
