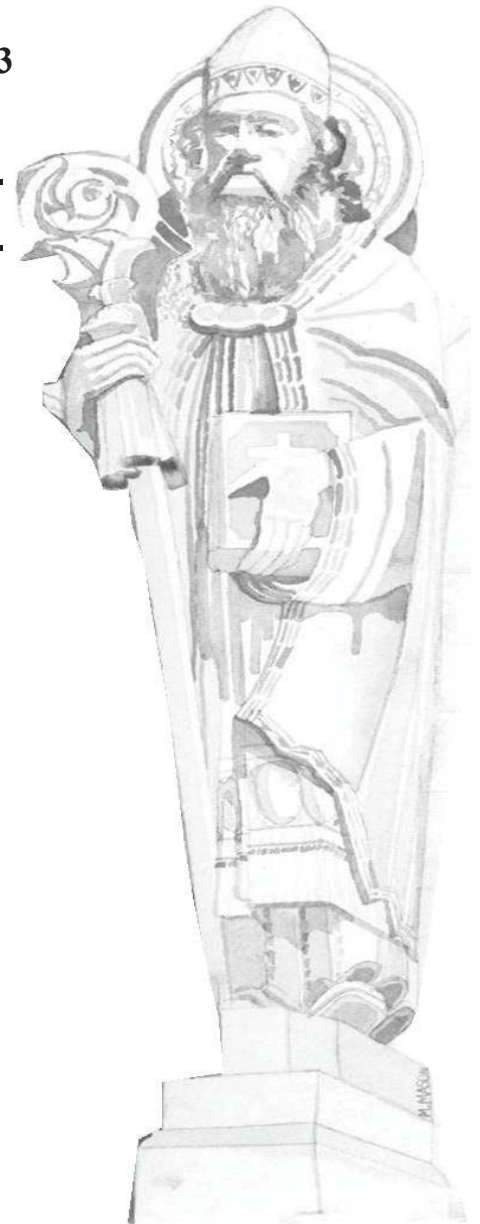

THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The people heard Bartimaeus call out for Jesus, but they tried to silence him. They would have preferred that he stay sitting on the side of the road, out of sight. There are so many things that we are blind to, just as the people in the gospel. We think that if we leave them sitting on the side of the road, they will be out of our way and forgotten. Bartimaeus struggled to see Jesus. He knew the healing power of Jesus and nothing could hold him or his faith down. Just as Jesus interceded for Bartimaeus, he goes before God for us as well. Bartimaeus had great faith, but he followed up that faith with gratitude and loyalty. When he received his sight, he showed thankfulness by following Jesus. While we don't hear about him specifically as a disciple, it is possible he stayed with Jesus from this point. It is the very kind of faith adventure to which each of us is called. But first, we need to open our eyes and call out to Jesus to heal our blind spots, then follow him - live the message in service, love and compassion in openness to the needs of those around us.
