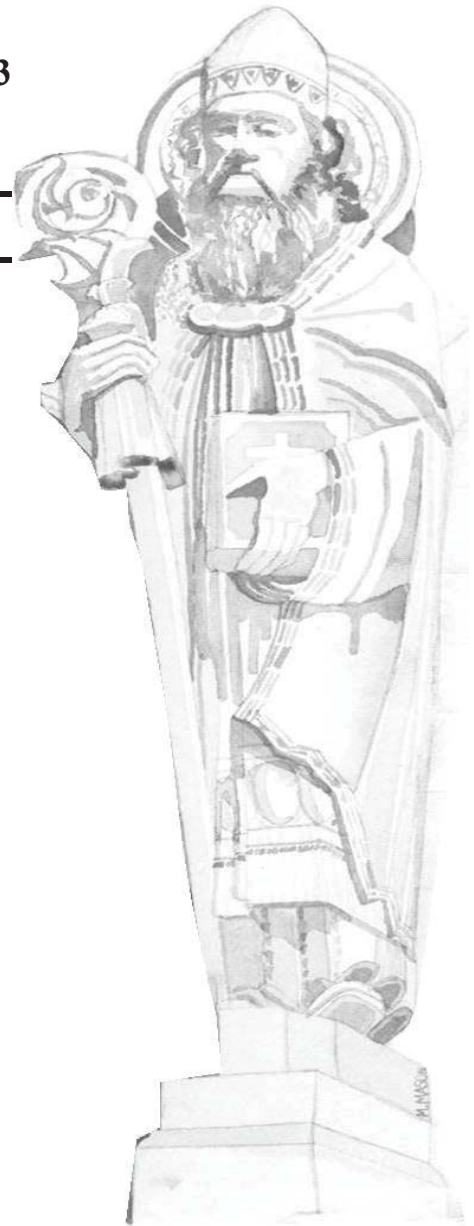

THE FEAST OF CHRIST THE KING

On this feast, an image filled with power and importance, we read that a portion of this gospel that speaks about our most insignificant brothers and sisters: "as often as you did it for one of my least brothers and sisters, you did it for me." there is a simple conclusion to be drawn here which I think we can assume Jesus intended. If Christ is the royal ruler of the universe and doing something for the least sister or brother is the same as doing it for Christ, then even the least among us are royalty. With this understanding our attempts to live the message of God's love should be easy and natural to our behavior.
