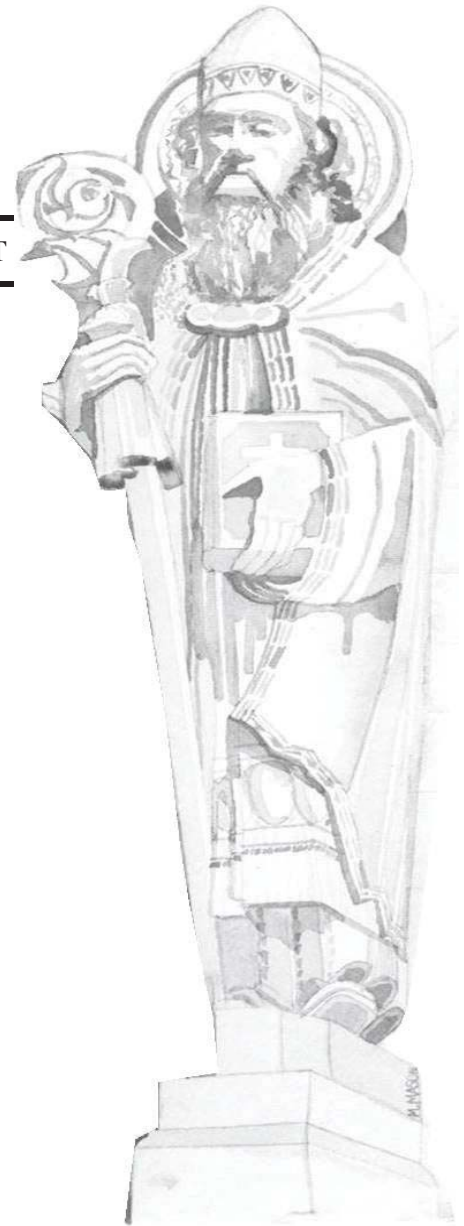

**THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT**

The First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of another liturgical year. Advent affords us the opportunity to reflect on the longing and hope that preceded Christ's birth, just as it beckons us to look forward to Christ's return at history's end. In keeping with the season's note of expectation, today's readings focus our attention on the in-breaking of God in human history. The Isaiah Oracle looks to a much desired peace and universal accord for a beleaguered Judah. The gospel reading comes from an era in the early church when Christ's return was strongly anticipated and preparedness was repeatedly counseled. Paul's exhortation to alertness highlights the extent to which Christian moral posture actually rests on future hope. During this Advent season let us be awakened once again to an awareness of the presence of God in our lives here and now even in the midst of the commercial distractions of the season.

**A Family Perspective**

In today's gospel Jesus advises: "Stay awake, watch out, and pray for the strength to hold your ground" when "fearful and bewildering signs" appear threatening your family. Resist being fear-filled. Instead "pray for strength" to be courageous.
