

#### SPONSORS FOR SACRAMENTS

From time to time questions arise concerning sponsorship for the Sacraments, specifically Baptism and Confirmation. By tradition, when an individual was preparing for Christian Initiation (Baptism and Confirmation), a member of the Church was appointed to assist him or her in the long preparation, to give testimony about readiness for the Sacraments, and later to help the new Christian persevere in and deepen his life in Christ. Sponsors are members of the Church who have been fully initiated themselves, and are now delegated to represent the Church community in the life of the candidate. They must be worthy themselves. They should be chosen because they live the life of Christians and because of their closeness to the Church. Any qualities of kinship or friendship are ineffective if this essential one is lacking. A sponsor must be 1) Spiritually qualified and sufficiently mature for the role. 2) Already initiated into the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist. 3) Legally free to exercise this rule (eg. Publically living in an invalid marriage would exclude from being a sponsor). Signs of vitality such as weekly celebration of the Eucharist, frequent reception of Communion, and a seriousness about one's own religious formation and growth should figure in the decision concerning a sponsor. All these elements should be considered in choosing or serving as a sponsor in the Sacraments.
